Located in Shiba Park with views of the nearby Tokyo Tower, **The Prince Park Tower Tokyo** offers a blend of natural and modern scenery throughout the changing seasons. It has 33 aboveground floors, 603 guest rooms, 17 banquet halls (including a main banquet hall of about 2,400 m²), a variety of restaurants, and a Spa and Fitness facility featuring natural hot springs.

The Hotel Seiryu Kyoto Kiyomizu is located in the building of the former Kiyomizu Elementary School, which was loved by the community as a learning center for about 80 years before its rebirth as a high-quality heritage hotel.
