Furano Ski Resort (Hokkaido)

Established in 1962, Furano Ski Resort is set against the breathtaking backdrop of the Tokachidake and Daisetsuzan mountain ranges. The resort offers two signature experiences: the exceptional "Furano Bonchi Powder," born from the unique topography and climate of the Furano Basin, and beautifully maintained, groomed runs that invite graceful cruising.

The resort features two distinct zones—Kitanomine and Furano—comprising a total of 28 varied courses designed to delight everyone from beginners to advanced skiers and snowboarders. Highlights include a 4,000-meter-long cruising course and the dynamic E1 course in the Furano Zone, located at an elevation of 1,064 meters. With an average gradient of 18° across 430 meters, this run offers thrilling undulations that continue to captivate snow enthusiasts season after season.

Shiga Kogen Yakebitaiyama Ski Resort (Nagano Prefecture)

Located in northern Nagano Prefecture, Shiga Kogen Yakebitaiyama Ski Resort lies within the Shiga Kogen UNESCO Eco-Park and offers conifer-lined forest trails stretching along the southeastern slopes of Mt. Yakebitaiyama (summit: 2,009 m). This expansive resort attracts visitors with its grand scale and consistent high-quality snow, thanks to its lofty altitude of 2,000 meters.

The resort is fully equipped with two gondolas and three lifts, serving a wide variety of trails designed to complement the natural terrain. With a maximum run length of 2,430 meters, it offers long cruising slopes alongside more technical options for seasoned skiers and snowboarders. The summit is 2,000 meters above sea level, offering sweeping panoramic views of the peaks of the Japanese Northern Alps and their majestic natural beauty.

Myoko Suginohara Ski Resort (Niigata Prefecture)

Situated along the eastern slope of Mt. Myoko (2,454 m), one of the Japan's celebrated One Hundred Mountains of Japan, Myoko Suginohara Ski Resort boasts an 8.5-km scenic route alongside a gondola lift that runs from the top to the bottom of a Northern Shinano snowfield with an altitude difference of 1,124 m.
